Takashi Iida is now a Professor of Philosophy at College of Humanities and Sciences, Nihon University.

He was born in Sapporo on 20th of October, 1948. He has been educated in Tokyo University and the University of Michigan. He taught at Kumamoto University from 1978 to 1988, Chiba University from 1988 to 1998, and Keio University from 1998 to 2010. Since 2010, he is teaching at Nihon University.

He was the President of the Japan Association for Philosophy of Science from 2005 to 2011. He was the President of the Philosophical Association of Japan from 2012 to 2015.

He has written in Japanese four volume introduction to the contemporary philosophy of language (*Gengo Tetsugaku Taizen*, 1987–2002, Keiso Shobo), a book on Wittgenstein (1997, Kodansha), and a small book on Kripkean interpretation of Wittgenstein (2004, NHK Publishing) as well as more than 50 papers .
